

We joined the GLOBAL GHOST GEAR INITIATIVE committed to driving solutions to the problem of lost and abandoned fishing gear worldwide.



Through CROWDFUNDING within 2 months we raised nearly 18.000 euros with the purpose of cleaning 10 tons of nets from the North Sea.
